

Dear Senator Boxer:

This is in final response to your inquiry to Mr. Kim Wallace, Assistant Secretary for Legislative Affairs, U.S. Department of the Treasury, on behalf of your constituent, Donald R. Signer. Your correspondence was forwarded to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration on November 24, 2010. Mr. Signer alleges fraud and harassment committed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and General Motors Corporation (GM).

On November 30, 2010, we advised you we were conducting a review of this matter and upon completion, to the extent allowable under the law, we would advise you of the results.

We have concluded our review of your constituent's allegations and have determined they are unsubstantiated. We found no evidence to support Mr. Signer's allegations of fraud and harassment committed by IRS officials. We found no evidence that IRS and GM officials conspired to commit fraud and to harass Mr. Signer by auditing his tax returns. The inquiry revealed that Mr. Signer's tax returns were examined because of legitimate IRS business reasons.

We appreciate the concerns raised by your constituent and thank you for bringing this matter to our attention.
