
Dear Representative Stark:

I wish to update you on the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration's (TIGTA's) response to my June 21, 2010 complaint. I alleged that General Motors and the Internal Revenue Service conspired in IRS audits in 2005 and 2008 to harass me into selling my GM franchises to GM. After nearly a year of multiple frustrating attempts at obtaining the status of my complaint, in June 2011 I obtained FOIA documents revealing that **TIGTA did not investigate my complaint**. TIGTA documents contain multiple false statements "justifying" avoidance of investigation, clearly pointing to an appalling cover-up of the GM/IRS conspiracy I allege. This information makes it obvious that TIGTA statements to me indicating it would conduct an investigation, and to you implying it had done so, were pure deception.

Since receiving evidence of the seemingly fraudulent TIGTA actions, I have written to a TIGTA FOIA attorney, Deputy Inspector General for Investigations Timothy Camus, Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration J. Russell George, and Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner. I have received no response. I have since spoken to the Department of Justice about TIGTA's actions, which referred me to the FBI to initiate an investigation. The FBI referred me back to the Department of Justice, which in turn suggested I talk to a Member of Congress for avenues of pursuit, apparently through the FBI.

I have enclosed a copy of my letter to Inspector General George, as well as a summary of TIGTA's actions following my June 2010 complaint, along with supporting documents. As I fully intend to hold all involved individuals at GM, the IRS, and now TIGTA, accountable for their disgraceful actions, I seek your thoughts on how best to achieve that goal once and for all.
